### Recreational Campfire

A 3' X 3' recreational campfire using clean, dry, untreated wood is the only type of burning permitted in St. Clair. Burning leaves and grass is NOT allowed. The following is an excerpt from the City Ordinance on Open Burning.

#### RECREATIONAL CAMPFIRE REGULATIONS and SAFEGUARDS

SIZE:	3' X 3' in diameter with a flame height not more than 4'
LOCATION:	At least 15' from any structure and 15' from the property line
WOOD:	<u>ONLY</u> clean, dry, untreated wood in lengths of 3' or less
WEATHER:	Consider wind and weather conditions prior to lighting a campfire
SMOKE:	<u>MINIMAL</u> detectable smoke, odor or soot should be noticed beyond the property line
SUPERVISION:	Campfires must be attended by a person 18 years of age or older
EXTINGUISH:	Extinguish the campfire completely before leaving the site

While burning a recreational campfire every effort must be taken to avoid creating a nuisance or a health or safety hazard. Recreational campfires are prohibited when the Blue Earth County Sheriff's Dept. or other authority has issued a burning ban.

## 2015 CITY WIDE CLEAN-UP DAY

# **SATURDAY, JULY 11<sup>th</sup>**

Items **MUST** be on the curb by 7 am on Clean-Up Day ... items may be set out 2 – 3 days before Clean-Up Day.

**REMEMBER:** "One man's trash is another man's treasure."

'RECYCLING' of Clean-Up Day items is encouraged! When Clean-Up Day items are recycled, it not only helps the environment by keeping items out of the landfill, it saves all of us money by reducing our disposal costs!

### **ACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

- General NON-HAZARDOUS Household Waste ... "JUNK".
- Furniture Items (Couches, Chairs, Tables, Mattresses, Box Springs, etc.).
- Small Amounts (approx. 90 gallons) Remodeling Materials. (Siding, Dry Wall, Carpet, DRIED OUT Paint Cans, etc.).
- Small Electronic Equipment (small AM/FM Radios, Phones, etc.).
- All items should be bagged, boxed or contained in a manageable manner.
- If items can be recycled, please do so in the appropriate manner.
- LJP Waste and Recycle reserves the right to refuse any items they deem unacceptable.

### **It's Clean-Up Time!!**

Round up the junk from your basement, garage, back yard and attic and get it to the curb for City Wide Clean-Up Day.

### **UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

- NO Yard Waste ... Grass Clippings, Shrubs, Plants, Tree Limbs, Leaves, Branches, etc.
- NO Hazardous Waste ... Paints, Liquids, Chemicals, Batteries, etc.
- NO TIRES ... TIRES WILL NO LONGER BE ACCEPTED ON CLEAN-UP DAY.
- NO Motor Oil or Oil Filters, Petroleum Products or Petroleum Product Containers, Fluorescent Lights, Incandescent Light Bulbs, Cement, Asphalt or Large Quantities of Remodeling Materials or Demolition Materials.

## **COLLECTION TAGS ARE REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:**

### **APPLIANCES** (Residential – Non Commercial Units ONLY)

- HOUSEHOLD-TYPE APPLIANCES (without Freon): \$ 26.00 each  
Includes: Stoves, Ovens, Microwaves, Washing Machines, Dryers, Dish Washers, Water Heaters and Water Softeners
- HOUSEHOLD-TYPE APPLIANCES (with Freon): \$ 30.00 each  
Includes: Refrigerators and Freezers (doors off), Window A/C Units, Dehumidifiers

### **PLEASE NOTE:**

Collection Tags must be purchased by 12 noon on Friday, July 10<sup>th</sup>.

### **ELECTRONICS**

- VCRs and DVD Players: \$ 6.00 each
- Personal Computers and Desktop Printers: \$ 10.00 each
- Desktop Copiers and Fax Machines: \$16.00 each
- Portable TVs and Monitors (regardless of size): \$ 35.00 each
- Console TVs and Console Stereos (Hi-Fi): \$ 35.00 each
