RECREATIONAL CAMPFIRE

A 3' X 3' recreational campfire using clean, dry, untreated wood is the only type of burning permitted in St. Clair. Burning leaves and grass is not allowed. The following is an excerpt from the City of St. Clair Burning Ordinance:

RECREATIONAL CAMPFIRE REGULATIONS & SAFEGUARDS

SIZE:	3' X 3' in diameter with a flame height not more than 4'
LOCATION:	at least 15' from any structure or property line
WOOD:	clean, dry, untreated wood in lengths of 3' or less
WEATHER:	consider wind and weather conditions prior to lighting a campfire
SMOKE:	minimal detectable smoke, odor or soot should be noticed beyond the property line
SUPERVISION:	campfires should be attended by a person 18 years of age or older
EXTINGUISH:	extinguish the campfire completely before leaving the site

While burning a recreational campfire, every effort should be taken to avoid creating a nuisance or a health or safety hazard.

Recreational campfires are prohibited when the Blue Earth County Sheriff's Dept. or other authority has issued a burning ban.

2016 CITY WIDE CLEAN-UP DAY

SATURDAY, JULY 16th

Items **MUST** be on the curb by 7 am on Clean-Up Day ... items may be set out 2 – 3 days before Clean-Up Day.

REMEMBER: "One man's trash is another man's treasure."

'RECYCLING' of Clean-Up Day items is encouraged! When Clean-Up Day items are recycled, it not only helps the environment by keeping items out of the landfill, it also saves all of us money by reducing our disposal costs!

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- GENERAL NON-HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE ... 'JUNK'.
- FURNITURE ITEMS (couches, chairs, tables, mattresses, box springs, etc.).
- CARPET and DRIED OUT PAINT CANS
- SMALL ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT (small AM/FM radios, phones, etc.).
- All items should be bagged, boxed or contained in a manageable manner.
- If items can be recycled, please do so in the appropriate manner.
- LJP Waste and Recycle reserves the right to refuse any items they deem unacceptable.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- NO YARD WASTE ... including, grass clippings, shrubs, plants, tree limbs, leaves, branches, etc.
- NO HAZARDOUS WASTE ... including, paints, liquids, chemicals, batteries, etc.
- NO REMODELING/CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS
- NO TIRES ... *Tires are no longer accepted on Clean-Up Day.*
- NO MOTOR OIL, PETROLEUM PRODUCTS, LIGHT BULBS, REMODELING MATERIALS, ETC. ... Including, oil filters, petroleum products or petroleum product containers, fluorescent lights, incandescent light bulbs, cement, asphalt, drywall, siding, or remodeling, demolition or construction materials.

COLLECTION TAGS ARE REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

(Collection Tags are available at: ST. CLAIR CITY HALL, 304 MAIN STREET WEST, ST. CLAIR)

APPLIANCES ((Residential – Non Commercial Units ONLY)

- HOUSEHOLD-TYPE APPLIANCES (*without Freon*): \$ 26.00 each
Includes: Stoves, Ovens, Microwaves, Washing Machines, Dryers, Dish Washers, Water Heaters and Water Softeners
- HOUSEHOLD-TYPE APPLIANCES (*with Freon*): \$ 30.00 each
Includes: Refrigerators and Freezers (doors off), Window A/C Units, Dehumidifiers

ELECTRONICS

- VCRs and DVD Players: \$ 6.00 each
- Personal Computers and Desktop Printers: \$ 10.00 each
- Desktop Copiers and Fax Machines: \$16.00 each
- Portable TVs and Monitors (regardless of size): \$ 35.00 each
- Console TVs and Console Stereos (Hi-Fi): \$ 35.00 each
