Call Gopher State One Call 811 before you dig. The One Call service will contact the underground utility providers in your area and have the utilities located and marked.

The One Call service is paid for by the utility providers and is at no cost to the property owner.

CALL 911 FOR ANY POLICE, FIRE OR MEDICAL EMERGENCY

REMINDER ... Construction season is here! A Building Permit is required for almost all building projects and construction in the City of St. Clair including: new home, addition to home/garage, storage buildings, re-roof, window replacement, siding, deck, porch, finishing basement, etc. Contact the City Clerk for a Building Permit Application or for other information before undertaking any building project.

PET OWNERS



Pet owners, please be respectful of your neighbors and follow the City of St. Clair Pet Ordinance:

- Keep your dog or cat on a leash or under your control at all times.
- Provide adequate leashing, fencing or other means to insure that your pet stays in your yard and doesn't run on neighboring property or throughout the neighborhood.
- Don't allow your dog to wander onto neighboring property to pee and poop.
- When walking your dog, pick-up after him! Carry a plastic bag with you and dispose of it properly when you get home.
- Don't allow your dog to habitually bark, whine and howl.
- Obtain a dog or cat license at City Hall.
- Dogs and cats found running at large will be impounded in Mankato. Retrieving an animal from the impound is very costly!!
