

CHRISTMAS TREE DROP-OFF SITE for St. Clair residents

Christmas trees can be dropped off near the dumpster in
the St. Clair City Hall Parking Lot on or before Monday,
January 7th.

*TREES ONLY ... NO garland, ornaments, tinsel, tree stands,
plastic wrap, etc.*



SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

The resident/occupant of any property abutting a public sidewalk is responsible for ice and snow removal. All ice and snow must be removed from public sidewalks within 36 hours after the ice or snow has ceased to fall. If the sidewalk is not cleared within the designated time the City will hire it done. The property owner will be charge \$50.00 each time it is necessary for the City to remove snow from the sidewalk.

DON'T GET TOWED!

Use off-street parking after any snowfall of 1" or more until the street has been plowed curb to curb.

If snowplows are forced to go around parked vehicles, the snow surrounding the car can create a hazard to the traveling public as well as plow operators and equipment.

Vehicles that have been parked on the street longer than twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall event and have prohibited the complete clearing of the street are subject to towing and impounding at the owners expense.

SNOWMOBILE OPERATORS

Within the City of St. Clair snowmobiles are to be driven on the right hand lane of the street as close as practical to the curb or edge of the street.

IT IS UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE A SNOWMOBILE:

- On a public sidewalk.
- On boulevards within any public right-of-way.
- On private property (without permission).
- In the City Park.


Anyone witnessing snowmobile violations are asked to call 911 immediately to report the incident.


Ribbons, bows & tinsel

Reduce or reuse. Cannot be recycled, place in garbage.



Broken Christmas decorations

Non-recyclable: place in a box & dispose of in household trash.



Cardboard

Remove all tape, flatten, and place into your curbside



Left overs

Food waste and unwanted leftovers can be composted.

Batteries

Drop off rechargeable batteries to be recycled:

- By appointment at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility

Styrofoam packaging

Styrofoam packaging is not accepted in curbside recycling bins. Please dispose of in garbage.



Wrapping paper

Before recycling, remove any tape & décor—ribbons & bows, crumple into a ball and place into your recycling bin.

* Foil and glitter decorated paper goes into general garbage.



Imitation Christmas tree & decor

Reduce, reuse, or DONATE! Imitation trees cannot be recycled.



Christmas tree
