WINTER REMINDERS

City residents are urged, as good neighbors and motorists, not to add to the hazards of wintertime driving.

- Use off-street parking during and after a snowfall event to allow for efficient snow plowing and snow removal.
- Property owners adjacent to sidewalks are responsible for snow and ice removal from the sidewalk.
- Snow from driveways, sidewalks and parking lots is not to be blown, plowed, shoveled or deposited in any way onto or across public streets.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to fences, vehicles, play equipment and/or other objects or obstacles parked or placed on the City right-of-way. The City road right-of-way is approx. 10' from the curb or edge of the street.



RECYCLING REMINDERS

ACCEPTABLE RECYCLABLE ITEMS:

- glass bottles and jars
- aluminum, tin, and metal cans
- #1 – #7 plastic food and beverage containers
- newspaper, junk mail, greeting cards, etc.
- paper boxes, cartons, corrugated cardboard
- empty paint cans

RECYCLING GUIDELINES:

- Flatten all cardboard boxes
- Empty and rinse all containers
- Do not flatten plastic containers
- No need to remove caps, lids, or plastic tabs

NON-RECYCLABLE ITEMS

- Styrofoam cups and Styrofoam packaging
- Plastic bags, plastic wraps and plastic film
- Plastic 6-pack holders
- Coffee filters and tea bags
- Candy and gum wrappers
- Gift wrap, tissue paper and wall paper
- Bathroom waste paper
- Photos, slides, and transparencies
- Window glass, auto glass, mirrors, light bulbs
- Ceramics, pyrex, and drinking glasses
- Oil, anti-freeze, and gas containers
- Aerosol cans, disposable razors, needles

BLUE EARTH COUNTY MEDICATION COLLECTION PROGRAM

The Blue Earth County Medication Collection Program is available to all Blue Earth County residents.

Hours: 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. (Monday-Friday)

Items ALLOWED:

- Prescription Medications
- Over the Counter Medications
- Narcotics and Other Controlled Substances
- Medication Samples
- Pet Medications
- Vitamins and Supplements
- Medicated Ointments and Lotions
- Inhalers
- Liquid Medications in Glass or Leak-proof Containers

Items NOT Allowed:

- Needles, Syringes or other Sharps
- Thermometers
- IV Bags
- Bloody or Infectious Waste
- Hydrogen Peroxide
- Business Waste

For disposal through the Blue Earth County Medication Collection Program, medications do not need to be in the original container. Remove as much packaging as possible. Containers with liquid contents should be placed in a plastic bag.

Medications dropped-off at the collection site are taken directly to an incinerator, where a deputy watches their destruction.
