WINTER REMINDERS

In the interest of public safety, St. Clair residents are urged to be good neighbors and motorists and follow the City the Snow Plowing and Snow Removal Ordinance. The following is a summary of the Ordinance:

- Use off-street parking after any snowfall of 1" or more until the street has been plowed curb to curb. If snowplows are forced to go around parked vehicles, the snow surrounding the car can create a hazard to the traveling public as well as plow operators and equipment. Vehicles that have been parked on the street longer than twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall event and have prohibited the complete clearing of the street are subject to towing and impounding.
- The resident/occupant of any property abutting a public sidewalk is responsible for ice and snow removal. All ice and snow must be removed from public sidewalks within 36 hours after the ice or snow has ceased to fall. If the sidewalk is not cleared within the designated time the City will hire it done at a charge to the property owner of \$50.00 per time.
- Residents with mailboxes are responsible for snow removal around the mailbox. .
- Dumping, blowing, shoveling, plowing or depositing snow onto or across any public street or alley is not allowed.
- No obstructions (garbage/recycling containers, landscaping items, basketball hoops or obstacles and items of any kind) should be placed on the road right-of-way, boulevard, street or alley in such a manner as to interfere with snow plowing and snow removal operations.
- The City is not be responsible for damage to vehicles, fences, play equipment, basketball hoops, landscaping items and other objects parked or placed on the City road right-of-way. The City road right-of-way is approx. 10' from the curb or the edge of the street on uncurbed streets.

CENSUS DAY IS WEDNESDAY, APRIL 1, 2020

March 2020	POSTCARD MAILING: Census postcards are sent to all housing units
March 12 – 20, 2020	MAILING 1: Letter with info to take census online (the majority of people will receive this) or Letter + Paper Survey (20 – 25% of people based on demographic characteristic and Internet connectivity of a geographic area will receive this)
March 16 – 24, 2020	MAILING 2: Reminder letter to all housing units
March 26 – April 3	MAILING 3: Postcard to non-respondents
April 1, 2020	CENSUS DAY
April 2020	MAILING 4: Letter + questionnaire to non-respondents
April 2020	MAILING 5: "It's not too late" postcard to non-respondents
May – July 2020	CONDUCT NON-RESPONSE FOLLOW-UP: Census workers visit addresses of non-respondents that did not complete a Census questionnaire and collect the information at the door

EVERY PERSON COUNTS – The census counts every person living in the United States once, only once, and in the right place. The Census counts every person regardless of age and regardless of citizenship status (citizens, non-citizen legal residents, non-citizen long-term visitors and undocumented immigrants). **If you live in the United States YOU COUNT!**
