What You Flush Matters!

DO NOT FLUSH ...

- ANY TYPE OF WIPE
 - baby wipes
 - cleaning wipes
 - disinfectant wipes
 - make-up wipes
- disposable diapers
- any feminine products
- facial tissue
- paper towels
- band aids, bandages & dressings
- dental floss
- cotton balls & Q-tips
- dryer sheets
- dryer lint
- mop heads
- rags & any cloth items
- Swiffers, scrub pads & sponges
- plastics bags
- cat litter & pet waste
- cigarette butts
- food items
- fats, oils, grease
- egg shells & coffee grounds
- unused medication or any pharmaceuticals
- paints, varnishes, solvents, sealers, thinners, etc.
- chemicals & hazardous waste/materials
- **OR any items other than human waste and toilet paper!**



REPORT STREET LIGHT OUTAGES

City sewer systems are not designed to handle items such as those listed above. Flushing such items can not only cause damage to pumps and equipment at the sewer plant, but can also clog and plug sewer mains and individual sewer lines resulting in back-ups into homes.

Even wipes that are labeled 'flushable' SHOULD NOT BE FLUSHED ... please dispose of them in your waste basket or garbage can.

Wipes do not degrade immediately after flushing they remain intact long enough to pass through the individual sewer lines, City sewer mains and into the City Wastewater Treatment Plant where they clog and plug pumps and other equipment.

PLEASE ... ONLY FLUSH TOILET PAPER!
